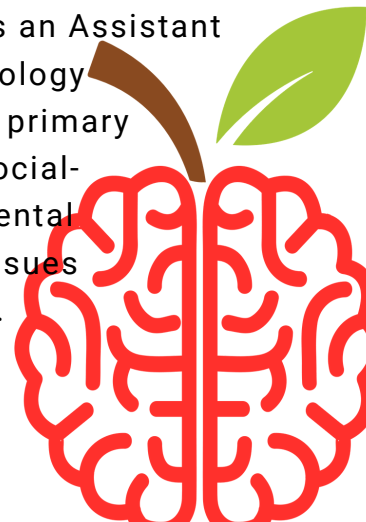


Jennifer Cooper, Ph.D, NCSP

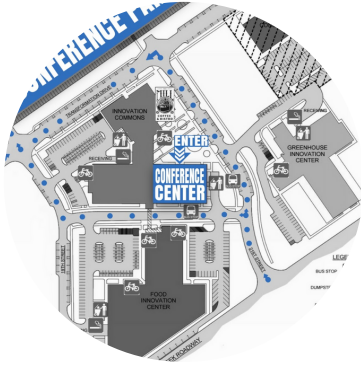
